

INSTRUCTIONS

FOR USE OF POKER METER

In all forms of poker there are three plays, namely, to "get out," or "stay," or "raise." These are shown on the Poker Meter by colors: Red means to "get out"—yellow means to "stay"—green means to "raise." When properly aligned, the small **arrow** over (or under in 5 Card Draw) your "hand" will point to one of these colors, thereby indicating what your play should be.

Assume that you are playing "5 Card Stud" and that you hold a pair of Aces, Kings, or Queens, on the second card. By aligning the black line on the **right** of "High Pair" (as printed on the sliding portion of the Poker Meter), with the black line on the **right** of "Second Card" (printed above the slide), you will find that the small **arrow** over the words "High Pair" points to the color "green"—meaning to "raise." The following drawing illustrates this play:



The same procedure follows for each stage of the three games shown on the Poker Meter, namely, aligning the black line on the **right** of your "hand" with the black line on the **right** of the particular stage of the game, and following the small **arrow**.

In "5 Card Draw" the arrows point down.

The terms "First Raise" and "Second Raise" refer to "raises" made by one or more of your opponents—not by you.

The plays shown on Poker Meter do not contemplate the use of wild cards.
